**Administration Commission** met in April and was encouraged to hear our average attendance and giving has increased. Our Everence accounts are opened and funded. We are still waiting on a final estimate for the roof repair before we can begin the process of approving the work and starting. We are working with our rental company and realtor to begin selling our rental at 204 E. Lawrence. This property should be listed in April yet. We will begin the budget process in our June commission meetings, which means you will have the budget paperwork in late May.

The board would like to thank everyone that was able to come and listen and participate in the meetings with Wes Bontrager from Yellow Creek affiliated with LMC, and Gene Hartman from Emma, affiliated with Evana.
