WORSHIP

Focus statement: At first glance, it seems rather strange that there are so few healing miracles of Jesus in John’s Gospel. There are only three of them. Healing was, after all, a major part of Jesus’ earthly ministry. And Jesus came to earth to begin to heal what is wrong on the earth. But then, John is much more interested in telling us who Jesus is than simply recalling what he did. It is also noteworthy that the first healing miracle in this Gospel was of a Gentile (The healing of the world will be for all peoples), and the last two healings were of Jews, and Jesus intentionally chose to do both of those healings on the Sabbath. Is there a connection between Sabbath and healing? The plot to kill Jesus grew out of Jesus’ healings on the Sabbath. To say that Jesus had a very different understanding of both healing and Sabbath than did the Pharisees and Jewish leaders, is a gross understatement. He most certainly did!
