Focus Statement: One of the dreadful things about darkness is that it hides what is there, and we are left to our imagination about what the darkness may be hiding. The light makes visible what is real and what has been mere imagination in the darkness. Light dispels darkness, exposes what was hidden in the darkness, and illuminates the way so we do not stumble and fall. The coming of light into a world that is covered in deep darkness and learning to walk in that light is one of the themes of Isaiah. Isaiah declares that when the Messiah comes, HE will not only bring the light, but

HE will be a new light in the world, a light that will bring deliverance from spiritual bondage, a light that will bring peace. And HE will be a light not only for Israel, but for all peoples of the earth. Jesus claimed to be the "Light of the World" and told His followers that they too are the light in this dark world.

2020 Angel Tree Family...

The family that we have chosen for the FMC congregation to adopt for Christmas this year is just a little different than in years past.

Samantha is a single mother of two very young children. Her husband left her and her children in April of this year. With no money and no job it wasn't long before she came to visit the Middlebury Food Pantry. We noticed from the beginning that Samantha was a wonderful mother and doing the very best that she could to provide for her children, never wanting special treatment or extra, never wanting to take home something that someone else could use. She and the children very soon became helpers at the food pantry, saying, "doing things for and with others really helps take your mind off of your own troubles."

Since we first met, Samantha has gotten a really good job at a local RV company and found a place to rent that was very accommodating in the beginning. But with small children and the Coronavirus hitting the nation, she has experienced several setbacks with illness and loss of pay, resulting in getting behind on her rent, and an auto repair that robbed her of transportation to get back and forth to work for a short time. With the help of numerous people and organizations that partner with the Food pantry and the Middlebury Trustee's Office, Samantha has been able to catch up nearly all of her past due bills. "The most amazing Christmas Miracle ever!!" In her words.

When we asked if we could adopt her family for Christmas she assured us that she had 3 modest gifts for each of her children to open on Christmas morning and that the greatest Christmas gift for her and her family has been the gift of God answering her prayers for the financial assistance that they have already received.

We would like to go one step further and take up an Angel Tree Offering in lieu of wrapped gifts this year. This collection would go on from now, until Christmas. Offerings can be dropped off at the church office, placed in the offering tray on Sunday mornings with a designation note of "Angel Tree" on it, or donated online at the FMC secure Offering portal. To ensure that the money goes toward the the Angel Tree Project, please write Angel Tree in the envelope number section. All monies raised would go to pay the remainder of outstanding debt that she still has and pay her January rent in advance.
