### "RISEN!"

every year. We are very familiar with the story of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, perhaps too familiar. I am not sure the impact of resurrection grips our hearts and imaginations anymore. Certainly, it does not like it did those in the first century, those who first discovered the empty tomb, or those who encountered the one who came out of the tomb alive. To those first century Christians, they never got over the resurrection.

Before Jesus came and ministered on the earth, the Jewish faithful believed that when a person dies, their body returns to the ground, and their spirit goes to a place called "Sheol." It is a dark, subterranean place for disembodied spirits which nobody knows very much about. And they believed that human spirits stayed there until the resurrection at the end of time, when all souls are resurrected to face a final judgment. That doesn't mean that "Sheol" was one big room, or that everyone experiences it the same way. The Apocryphal Book of Enoch states that Sheol is divided into 4 chambers, that it is a place of rest and peace for the righteous, but a place of torment for the wicked, and which chamber one goes into is dependent on how they lived their life on the earth.

Jesus didn't counter that thinking, nor did He speak to the issue. But what Jesus did was to add a new dimension for His Followers. Jesus promised His disciples that He is going to heaven to prepare a place for them, and that He would come back to take them to be with Him (John 14:2-3). Jesus prayed and asked the Father to bring His followers to heaven to be with Him there (John 17:24). And Jesus showed John, in that great vision we call "Revelation" human souls already in heaven worshipping God (Revelation 7:9-10). Jesus' resurrection opened the door to heaven for followers of Jesus.

And this idea of Jesus overcoming the powers of death, that death is not the end, that death is a transition from earth to heaven for the faithful, was so overwhelming to those first believers, they celebrated the resurrection of their Lord every week on the first day of the week. And soon they began to call it "The Lord's Day" in honor of Jesus' resurrection.

And yet, I think we have still not yet grasped the full significance of resurrection. Jesus' resurrection, and the new life that came out of that tomb on Easter morning, wasn't meant for Jesus alone, to be lived out in His resurrected body. The significance of Jesus' resurrection is that His resurrected life can now come to life in us. Jesus can be raised to new life in us. Most Christians today have never grasped this awesome concept, of Jesus being raised to life in them. And yet, this is the Gospel message, that Jesus rises to live in those who will follow Him. 


